Amo Brass is committed to standing up against racism, sexism, and systemic inequalities which plague the field of classical music.

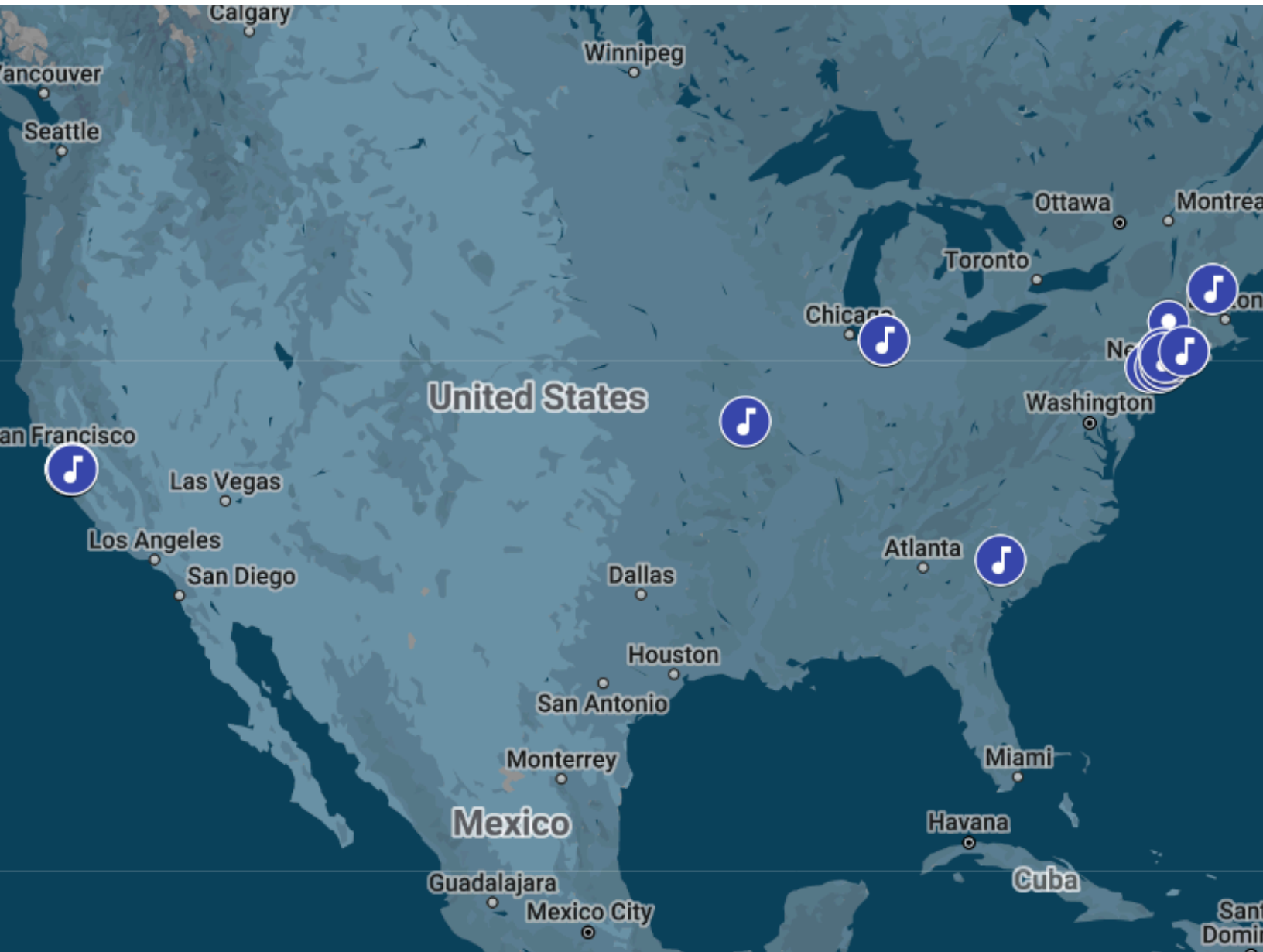
All members are alumni of the Yale Music in Schools Initiative, which delivers free music education to underserved public school students of the New Haven community.

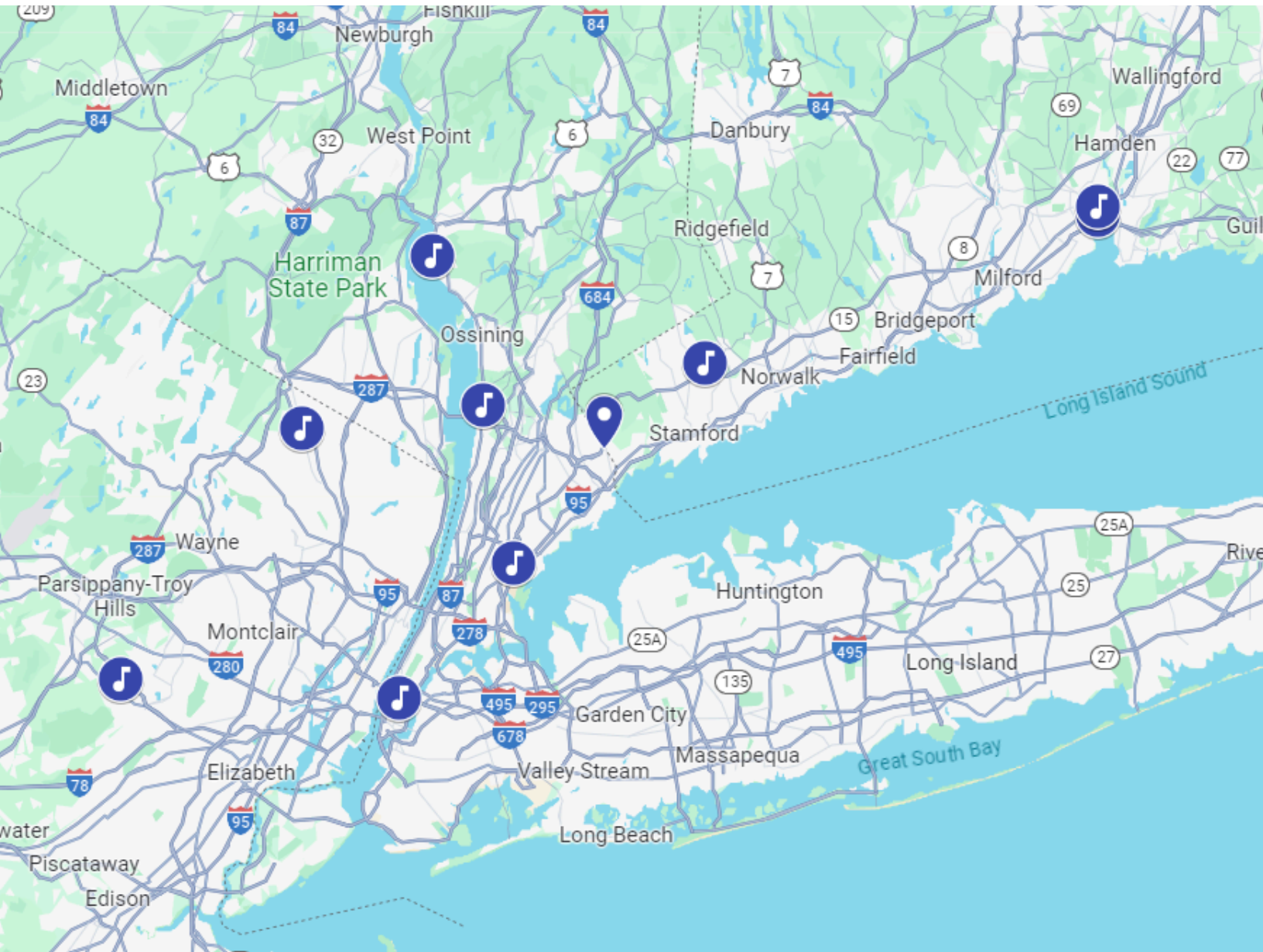
This year, Amo Brass...

MUSICAL *IMPACT* REVIEW

This year, Amo visited **8 states** and reached over **830 students**. We taught at **18 public schools** in **7 school districts**, delivering **38 educational events** to students aged 5 through 18.

With a passion for exploration and a commitment to musical excellence, Amo Brass concerts are known for creating an engaging and captivating experience for audiences.



TEACHING HIGHLIGHTS

Our teaching philosophy centers connectivity between people and an accessible, diverse curriculum. We believe that this is best achieved through in-person mentorship, in which students can partake in active music making. We delivered a side-by-side brass concert in California where students and Amo members took the stage as one ensemble.

GROUP HIGHLIGHTS

We spent a week at the prestigious Avaloch Farm Music Institute in July, brainstorming and rehearsing repertoire for our upcoming season.

AWARD WINNING

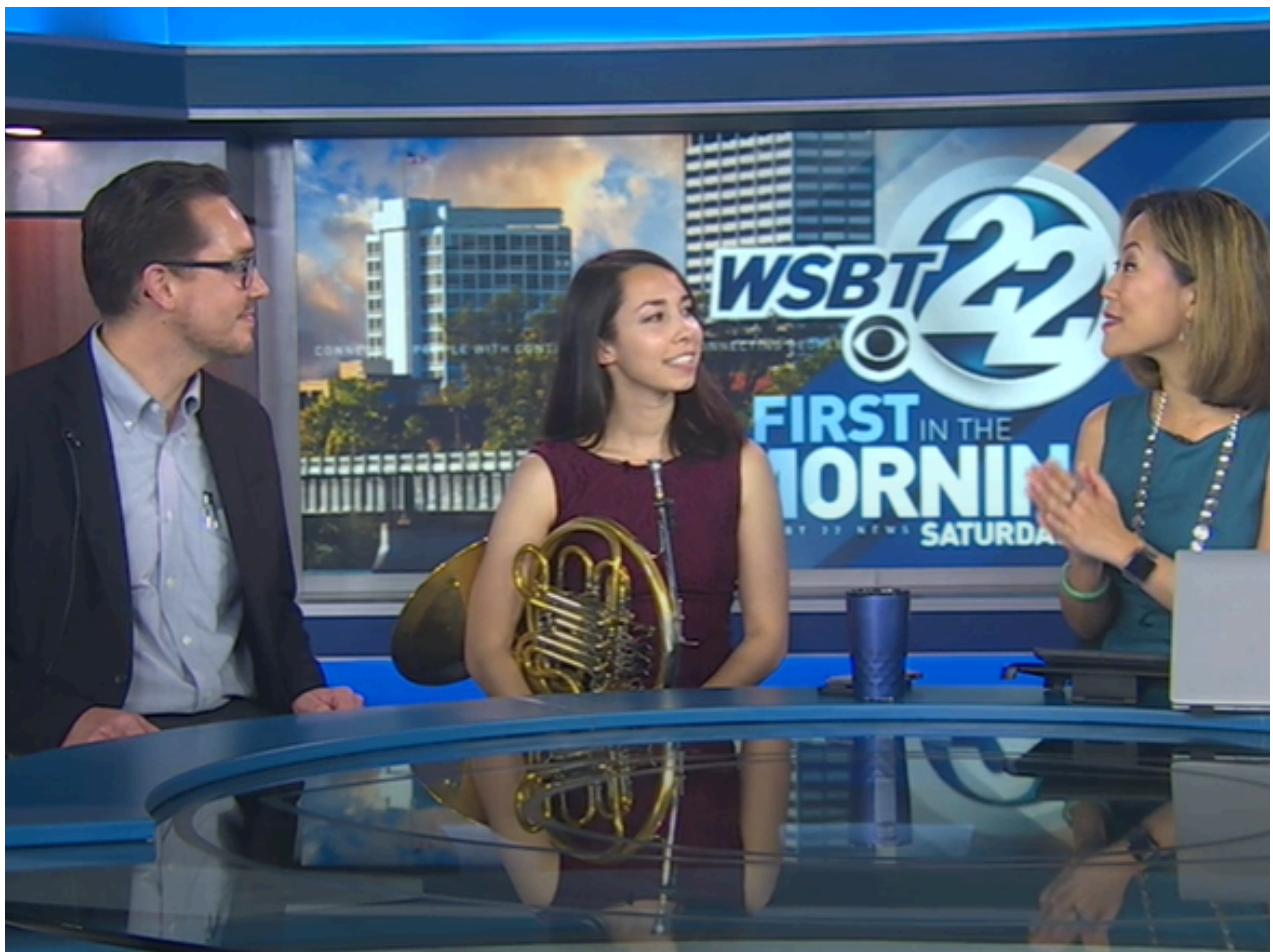

Amo made several appearances in local news this year, and even had our first live TV performance! Olivia participated in an interview on a WSBT 22 morning broadcast.

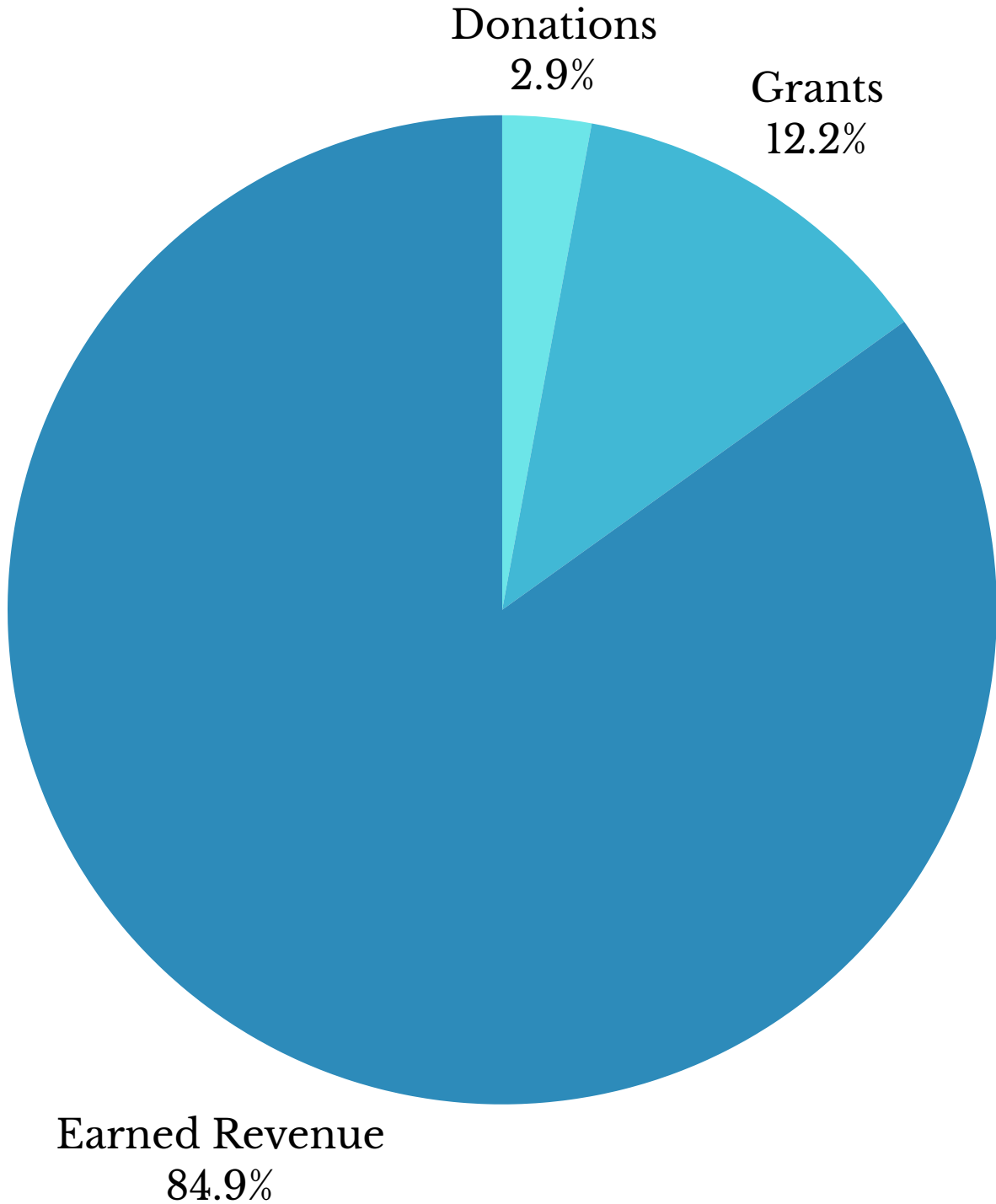


ANNUAL *REVENUE*
